OVERVIEW

Through a balanced combination of studio **practice**, **theoretical knowledge** and **industry driven methodologies**, the course allows students to conceive, develop and manage luxury interior projects in high end residential and hospitality contexts, integrating heritage, innovation and contemporary lifestyle trends into every design gesture. During the academic path, students progressively build a **personal creative and professional vision** aligned with international luxury standards.

First Year: Advanced interior design studios (luxury residential & hospitality), brand and experience design, sustainability & wellbeing, digital innovation (AI, BIM, smart environments), materials and craftsmanship.

Second Year: Project & Construction Management, large-scale luxury interiors (villas, suites, spas, F&B, branded residences), budgeting & tendering, performance metrics, executive reviews, portfolio refinement and industry-facing presentations.

After the 2Y Master in Luxury Interior Design & Management, students can pursue careers as:
